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# TALLAHASSEE COMMUNITY TOWN AND GOWN SURVEY INTRODUCTION

The Town and Gown Relations Project is a project of the Tallahassee Community College Foundation. It was conceived and initiated by project director, fundraiser and community activist Michael Pate. Oppenheim Research was retained by Michael Pate to develop a research approach and execute two surveys consisting of Tallahassee residents and community leaders. Oppenheim pre-tested the questions to be used for the community and leadership surveys by conducting a focus group and implementing the feedback from the focus group for the community and leadership surveys. Funding for the project was provided by the City of Tallahassee, Leon County, Florida State University, Florida A&M University, Tallahassee Community College and many other local organizations and businesses .

The Town and Gown Relations Project use a three phase approach and include:

### 1. A study of perceptions of town/gown relations in Tallahassee

Surveying a randomly selected segment of the community by phone, including landlines and cell phones and conducting in-depth interviews with key leaders in the community to gain an understanding of exactly how the community perceives town/gown relations in Tallahassee.

# 2. Town hall forums to discuss the research and best practices

Following the data collection and analysis from the surveys the results will be presented to the community to give them an opportunity to understand the findings and respond to them. In addition, a series of town hall forums will be held to present best practice examples from other communities that Tallahassee could implement to improve town/gown relations. The forums will be run by The Village Square and will be presented by representatives from other communities from around the country who will be identified as having a best practice that should be shared with the Tallahassee community.

# 3. Creation of a process to pursue excellence in town/gown relations

Key stakeholders will come together to evaluate the data from the survey, input from the best practice forums and feedback from the community. From that information they will develop a process for Tallahassee that will help the community become a best practice example for other communities in the area of town and gown relations.

The citizen telephone survey was conducted from October 4 to 28, 2010 to ascertain opinions on several topics. Among them:

- How leaders in our community are viewed by citizens;
- Is there a connection between leaders and citizens;
- Leadership roles to involve citizens in economic development and economic growth diversification;

- Identifying leadership roles to bridge gaps of communication between institutions and the community;
- Citizen involvement to aid economic diversification and to foster a diverse and creative workforce.

The leadership survey conducted between October 28 and November 19, 2010 addressed similar topics and explored in depth:

- How leaders from institutions and the community could involve citizens to play a greater role in economic development and diversification;
- How local, state and educational institutions can work together to achieve common goals;
- Creating more opportunities for local and small businesses;
- Providing more opportunities for young professionals; and
- How to keep talent here.

The community survey was conducted between October 4 and 28, 2010 and the appendix of this report contains all frequency tables and selected cross-tabulations.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### THE RESPONDENTS

- The respondents (813) represented a cross-section of age groups with the majority of the respondents of working age. By racial/ethnic category, the respondents were representative of Tallahassee in composition. Males and females were evenly split. Most respondents identified themselves as long time Tallahassee residents with 50% of respondents having lived in Tallahassee over 10 years and 21% of respondents having lived in Tallahassee their entire lives. Sixteen percent indicated they had lived here between five and ten years and 13% said they had lived in Tallahassee for less than 5 years.
- Respondents to the survey overwhelmingly agreed that university, college, business, government and community leaders should meet regularly regarding economic development opportunities, with 65% of respondents strongly agreeing and 30% of respondents somewhat agreeing. Only 4% of respondents felt disagreement or did not offer an opinion.
- When asked about forces that promote economic prosperity, in addition to jobs, responses were varied but the most common response was "do not know" with 22% of respondents indicating so. Some 14% named economic/business development and spending while 9% or respondents named community events/football/conventions. Education was cited by 8% of respondents.

#### EFFORTS BY LOCAL UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES

- Respondents were asked their opinion about whether or not they thought local universities and colleges are working with community groups (such as youth groups, neighborhood associations, civic clubs, arts and culture groups, business organizations and the like) to form meaningful relationships that benefit the whole community. A strong majority of respondents indicated that they felt our universities and colleges were working with community groups with 35% saying "yes" and another 35% saying "yes, sometimes". Fourteen percent (14%) answered "no" that universities and colleges are not working with community groups.
- When asked about how meaningful these relationships are an overwhelming majority of respondents indicated so with 44% saying they were "very meaningful" and 52% indicating they are "somewhat meaningful". Only 3% thought the relationships were "not very meaningful" and just 1% said they were "not meaningful at all".
- When asked about the frequency that universities and colleges include citizens in discussions about forming community relationships that benefit the community as a whole, a large majority of the respondents indicated there was inclusion, however only 6% indicated at that citizens were "always" included and just 18% indicated that citizens were "frequently" included. Just over half (54%) indicated that citizens were included

"sometimes". A small percentage (8%) indicated that citizens are never included in discussions.

- When respondents were asked about their participation in discussions between universities and colleges and the community; only 20% indicated they had ever been a participant while 80% had not.
- When asked about the importance of the role of universities and colleges in facilitating local economic growth, respondents indicated it was "very important" 65% of the time and "somewhat important" 30% of the time. Understandably, those employed by universities and colleges most often (85%) thought the role of universities and colleges to be "very important".
- Respondents were also asked to name the benefits from universities and colleges to the local economy. The economic/financial impact of spending by students and visitors was the most cited benefit with 29% of respondents naming this benefit. Jobs and workforce were the next most often cited benefit at 18% followed by education with 10%.

#### EFFORTS BY LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

- Respondents were asked similar questions regarding how they thought about how local government is working with community groups to form meaningful relationships that would benefit the entire community. Respondents answered similarly with a clear majority indicating that local government is working together with community groups, 31% saying "yes" and 41% saying "yes, sometimes". In the negative, 19% of respondents said "no", local government was not working with community groups.
- As for the importance of forming relationships between local government and community groups, answers were again very similar, with 40% of respondents saying the relationships were "very meaningful" and 57% saying they are somewhat meaningful. Mirroring the responses concerning universities and colleges and community groups, only 3% of respondents thought the relationships between local government and community groups to be "not very meaningful".
- When asked about the frequency of local government including citizens in discussions to form community relationships, respondents expressed that citizens were included in discussions slightly more often than they were by local universities and colleges, with 7% saying "always", 25% saying "frequently" and 53% indicating "sometimes".
- When asked about their own participation in discussions between local government and the community 31% indicated they had participated in discussions while 69% had not.
- An overwhelming majority (78%) indicated it was "very important" for local government to include citizens in discussions for form meaningful plans for economic development. Another 20% indicated it was "somewhat important" and 2% said it was "not very" or "not important at all" to include citizens.

#### UNIVERSITIES/COLLEGES AND GOVERNMENT EFFORTS

- When asked if our local universities and colleges are working with local governments to form meaningful relationships that benefit the whole community, a majority of respondents indicated they were with 28% saying "yes" and 44% saying "yes, sometimes". Only 13% said "no" they were not working together and 15% ether did not know or offered no opinion.
- As for the importance of forming relationships between universities and colleges and local government groups, answers were again very similar, with 40% of respondents saying the relationships were "very meaningful" and 55% saying they are somewhat meaningful. About only 6% of respondents thought the relationships between universities and colleges and local governments to be "not very meaningful" and "not meaningful at all".

# **QUALITY OF COMMUNICATIONS**

- In rating the quality of communications between the universities and colleges and the local government, only 5% rated communications "excellent", while 43% rated them "good". On the negative side, 32% said communications were "fair" and 9% said they were "poor".
- Respondents rated the quality of communications between the local universities and colleges and the community at large nearly the same with just slightly more respondents saying the communications were "poor" (11%).
- Respondents had a lower opinion of the quality of communications between the local government and the community at large with only 5% rating them "excellent" and 37% rating them "good". On the negative side 36% said communications were "fair" while 18% said they were "poor".

#### **MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES**

- The number one issue rated as very important was "economic development partnerships", followed by "using university research to create jobs and new businesses", "public safety issues", "public transportation", and "how universities communicate with residents". The next most frequently named as "very important" were "sporting events", "how government can encourage starting new businesses", and "getting students engaged in the Tallahassee community".
- The second most important issues chosen most frequently were "public safety issues", "using university research to create jobs and new businesses", "economic development partnerships", followed by "traffic issues", and "public transportation".

#### **COMMUNITY SURVEY FINDINGS**

#### **OVERALL IMPRESSIONS**

All survey respondents were first given the following definition of Town and Gown Relation: A community that has good "Town and Gown Relations" will be one where local universities and colleges, local governments and the local community work together on issues that are of importance to the whole community.

When asked to identify university communities that in their opinion had "good" town and gown relations, just over half (56%) indicated that they could not identify any. Of the remaining 44%, Gainesville (32%), Miami (8%), Tampa (7%), and Orlando (6%) were the most frequently cited communities. Next most frequently cited were Athens, Atlanta and Austin by 3% respectively. The responses to this question may be indicative of a respondents personal familiarity with a specific university or college rather than actual knowledge of "town and gown" relations. The responses may not offer much insight into model communities.

#### THE RESPONDENTS

The respondents represented a cross-section of age groups with the majority of the respondents of working age. By racial/ethnic category, the respondents were representative of Tallahassee in composition. Males and females were evenly split. Most respondents identified themselves as long time Tallahassee residents with 50% of respondents having lived in Tallahassee over 10 years and 21% of respondents having lived in Tallahassee their entire lives. Sixteen percent indicated they had lived here between five and ten years and 13% said they had lived in Tallahassee for less than 5 years. Most respondents (68%) were employed. Of the employed respondents, 42% work in government (state government, university/college, or education K-12) and 40% are employed in the private sector. The remaining (18%) indicated "other" as their employment.

Of those who were not employed, 63% said they were either retired or disabled, 12% indicated they were unemployed, 11% were students, and the remainder (14%) said they were homemakers or "other". Of those identifying themselves as either students or "other" about half (49%) indicated that they were planning on staying in Tallahassee to pursue their career.

The majority of respondents (77%) had some level of education beyond high school and of those with a degree, just under half (48%) indicated they had graduated from a local college or university. Seventeen percent of respondents had completed high school, while just 4% indicated that they had less than a high school education.

Politically, the respondents were balanced with a small tilt toward being conservative. Twenty-five percent indicated they were either liberal or very liberal, 36% said they were "middle of the road", and 35% identified themselves as conservative or very conservative.

Income levels of participants were also well balanced with 22% of respondents earning less than \$35,000 per year, 52% earning between \$35,000 and \$100,000, and 18% earning over \$100,000

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per year.

When asked about forces that promote economic prosperity, in addition to jobs, responses were varied but the most common response was "do not know" with 22% of respondents indicating so. Some 14% named economic/business development and spending while 9% or respondents named community events/football/conventions. Education was cited by 8% of respondents.

Respondents indicated they receive most of their civic information form three main sources; television/news/special TV shows 34%, local newspaper 27%, and the internet 19%. When asked about cooperation by civic leaders with others who don't share their political views, 83% of respondents said it was either "extremely important" or "very important" that they do cooperate.

Respondents to the survey overwhelmingly agreed that university, college, business, government and community leaders should meet regularly regarding economic development opportunities, with 65% of respondents strongly agreeing and 30% of respondents somewhat agreeing. Only 4% of respondents felt disagreement or did not offer an opinion.

#### EFFORTS BY LOCAL UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES

Respondents were asked their opinion about whether or not they thought local universities and colleges are working with community groups (such as youth groups, neighborhood associations, civic clubs, arts and culture groups, business organizations and the like) to form meaningful relationships that benefit the whole community. A strong majority of respondents indicated that they felt our universities and colleges were working with community groups with 35% saying "yes" and another 35% saying "yes, sometimes". Fourteen percent (14%) answered "no" that universities and colleges are not working with community groups, while 16% either did not know or had no opinion.

Question 4: Would you say our local universities and colleges are working together with community groups (such as youth groups, Neighborhood Associations, civic clubs, arts and culture groups, business organizations and the like) to form meaningful relationships that benefit the whole community?

Not surprisingly, those in the 18-24 age group most often responded "yes" or "yes, sometimes" to this question compared to other age groups, possibly due to greater exposure to activities at local universities and colleges. A majority of all employment groups indicated either "yes" or "yes, sometimes", with those employed in education k-12 responding this way the most often at 81%.

When asked about how meaningful these relationships are an overwhelming majority of respondents indicated so with 44% saying they were "very meaningful" and 52% indicating they are "somewhat meaningful". Only 3% thought the relationships were "not very meaningful" and just 1% said they were "not meaningful at all".

When asked about the frequency that universities and colleges include citizens in discussions about forming community relationships that benefit the community as a whole, a large majority of the respondents indicated there was inclusion, however only 6% indicated at that citizens were "always" included and just 18% indicated that citizens were "frequently" included. Just over half (54%) indicated that citizens were included "sometimes". A small percentage (8%) indicated that citizens are never included in discussions and 14% either did not know or did not provide a response.

Again, respondents in the 18-24 age group were more likely to respond that citizens were either "always" or "frequently" included in discussions. All categories of employment consistently responded either "always" or "frequently" just over 20% of the time with the exception of university and college employees who responded in this manner 33% of the time.

When respondents were asked about their participation in discussions between universities and colleges and the community; only 20% indicated they had ever been a participant while 80% had not.

Of the respondents who had participated in discussions, the likelihood of them having participated increased with the education level they reported having. Those completing high school indicated "yes" to participation just 13% of the time while those with a degree beyond a master's degree reported participating 54% of the time. Respondents who graduated from a local university or college (29%) reported having participated at a higher rate than non-local graduates (17%). Those employed by universities and colleges and by education k-12 were more likely than other employment groups to have participated in discussions.

When asked about the importance of the role of universities and colleges in facilitating local economic growth, respondents indicated it was "very important" 65% of the time and "somewhat important" 30% of the time. Understandably, those employed by universities and colleges most often (85%) thought the role of universities and colleges to be "very important".

Respondents were also asked to name the benefits from universities and colleges to the local economy. The economic/financial impact of spending by students and visitors was the most cited benefit with 29% of respondents naming this benefit. Jobs and workforce were the next most often cited benefit at 18% followed by education with 10%. Other responses included:

- Growth (6%)
- Sporting events (5%)
- University research (4%)
- University student volunteering and retention (3%)
- Housing (3%)
- Communication, quality of life and intellectual benefits respectively (2%)
- Cultural benefits (1%)

This question was asked as an open-ended response and responses were later grouped and coded into categories that best reflected the respondents answers. The table includes multiple responses.

#### EFFORTS BY LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

Respondents were asked similar questions regarding how they thought about how local government is working with community groups to form meaningful relationships that would benefit the entire community. Respondents answered similarly with a clear majority indicating that local government is working together with community groups, 31% saying "yes" and 41% saying "yes, sometimes". In the negative, 19% of respondents said "no", local government was not working with community groups. Nine percent of respondents either did not know or did not have an opinion.

Employment mattered somewhat in that respondents employed by universities and colleges and by education k-12 were more likely than state government or private employment to say local governments are working together with community groups although a majority of all employment groups felt this way.

As for the importance of forming relationships between local government and community groups, answers were again very similar, with 40% of respondents saying the relationships were "very meaningful" and 57% saying they are somewhat meaningful. Mirroring the responses concerning universities and colleges and community groups, only 3% of respondents thought the relationships between local government and community groups to be "not very meaningful".

When asked about the frequency of local government including citizens in discussions to form community relationships, respondents expressed that citizens were included in discussions slightly more often than they were by local universities and colleges, with 7% saying "always", 25% saying "frequently" and 53% indicating "sometimes". Eight percent said citizens were never included and 6% either did not know or had no opinion.

Those with a degree higher than a bachelor degree generally felt local governments include citizens more often than those with lower levels of education. Persons aged 55 and older were more likely to indicate inclusion in discussions, for instance 40% of those in the 55-64 age groups indicated that citizens were "always" or "frequently" included while only 28% of those in the 25 to 34 age group felt the same. Those employed by k-12 education (52%) were more likely to respond than other employment groups that local governments include citizens in discussions either "always" or "frequently".

When asked about their own participation in discussions between local government and the community 31% indicated they had participated in discussions while 69% had not.

Respondents showed a consistent pattern of those having a higher level of education were more likely to have participated in discussions. Those with a high school education reported participating 21% of time while those with an education higher than a master's degree reported participating 46% of the time. Those in the 18 to 24 age group were least likely to have participated in discussion with only 17% indicating they had, the next nearest group was those aged 25 to 34 who indicated they had participated 28% of the time. Somewhat contradicting to the previous question, those employed by education k-12 were the least likely employment group to have participated in discussions between local government and the community, indicating "yes" only 19% of the time while state government employees were most likely to have participated at 38%.

An overwhelming majority (78%) indicated it was "very important" for local government to include citizens in discussions for form meaningful plans for economic development. Another 20% indicated it was "somewhat important" and 2% said it was "not very" or "not important at all" to include citizens.

#### UNIVERSITIES/COLLEGES AND GOVERNMENT EFFORTS

When asked if our local universities and colleges are working with local governments to form meaningful relationships that benefit the whole community, a majority of respondents indicated they were with 28% saying "yes" and 44% saying "yes, sometimes". Only 13% said "no" they were not working together and 15% ether did not know or offered no opinion.

As for the importance of forming relationships between universities and colleges and local government groups, answers were again very similar, with 40% of respondents saying the relationships were "very meaningful" and 55% saying they are somewhat meaningful. About only 6% of respondents thought the relationships between universities and colleges and local governments to be "not very meaningful" and "not meaningful at all".

Generally, those who found these relationships to be "very meaningful" were likely to have a higher level of education. Of employment groups, respondents employed by universities and colleges and by education k-12 were most likely to say these groups are working together.

#### **CROSS ENTITY COMPARISONS**

By having asked like questions about the different entities' relationships, we have included some comparisons for the three different relationships. When asked about the entities working together with community groups, respondents responded with a "yes" most often (35% of the time) when considering universities and colleges, followed by local governments at 31% and the cooperation between the universities and colleges with the local governments at only 28%. However, when allowing for "yes, sometimes" and "no" responses the majority of respondents (60%) felt that governments are only sometimes or not at all working together with community groups, followed by universities/colleges and governments only sometimes or not at all working together with 57% while 49% of respondents felt that universities/colleges and community groups are working together sometimes or not at all.

It is also interesting to note that of those who indicated that "no" the entities were not working with community groups or each other, 19% of respondents did not think local government were working together with community groups, 14% of respondents responded "no" when asked about universities and colleges and 13% indicated that universities and colleges were not working together with local governments.

When asked about the meaningfulness of these same three relationships, respondents indicated that the relationship between the universities and colleges and community groups was "very meaningful" 44% of the time. The relationships between local governments and community groups and the relationship between the universities and colleges and the local government were both "very meaningful" to 40% of the respondents. However, the majority of respondents felt that these relationships are only somewhat meaningful between governments and community groups (57%), universities and colleges and governments (54%) and universities and colleges and community groups (52%).

When asked about how often citizens were included in discussions to form community relationships that benefit the entire community, respondents indicated that local government more frequently included citizens in those discussions. Those responding that citizens were either "always" or "frequently" included by universities and colleges equaled 24% while local governments were perceived as inclusive 32% of the time.

Going hand in hand with this observation is that 20% of respondents indicated they had participated in discussions personally with universities and colleges while 31% had participated in discussion with local governments.

#### **QUALITY OF COMMUNICATIONS**

Respondents were also asked about the quality of communications between universities and colleges, the local government, and the local community.

In rating the quality of communications between the universities and colleges and the local government, only 5% rated communications "excellent", while 43% rated them "good". On the negative side, 32% said communications were "fair" and 9% said they were "poor". Respondents either did not know or did not offer an opinion 12% of the time. Of employment groups, those employed by education k-12 rated communications either "excellent" or "good" 74% of the time whereas less than 50% of all other employment groups rated communication the same.

Respondents rated the quality of communications between the local universities and colleges and the community at large nearly the same with just slightly more respondents saying the communications were "poor" (11%).

Respondents had a lower opinion of the quality of communications between the local government and the community at large with only 5% rating them "excellent" and 37% rating them "good". On the negative side 36% said communications were "fair" while 18% said they were "poor". Just 4% either did not know or did not offer an opinion. Those employed in education k-12 rated this communication either "excellent" or "good" 63% of the time while all other employment groups indicated the same rating less than 50% of the time.

#### **MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES**

Respondents were then asked about the importance of issues to the community at large where local universities and colleges, the local government, and the local community work together. Respondents were asked to respond to a list of issues and rate each issue independently as to whether it is "very important", "somewhat important", "not very important", or "not important at all". Respondents could also provide a 'don't know/NA" response. The rating for each issue is shown in the table below by order ranking of "very important".

The 20 issues on the list were randomly administered to avoid order bias.

Respondents were then asked to rank those they identified as "very important" as to which was most, second most and third most important to have "good" town and gown relations. The number one issue rated as very important was "economic development partnerships", followed by "using university research to create jobs and new businesses", "public safety issues", "public transportation", and "how universities communicate with residents". The next most frequently named as "very important" were "sporting events", "how government can encourage starting new businesses", and "getting students engaged in the Tallahassee community".

The second most important issues chosen most frequently were "public safety issues", "using university research to create jobs and new businesses", "economic development partnerships", followed by "traffic issues", and "public transportation".

There was a difference educationally among those finding "economic development partnerships to be "very important" as they were more likely to have a degree higher than a bachelor degree. For example, those with a bachelor's degree felt "economic development partnerships" were "very important" 72% of the time while those with a degree higher than a master's degree thought this category was "very important" 81% of the time. Education also played a role in how respondents viewed "public safety issues" in that consistently those with a lower level of education were more likely to indicate that this issue was "very important". Education had the same impact on those naming "using university research to create jobs and new business" as "very important" as with "economic development partnerships" where those with a higher education were most likely to stress the importance of this issue.

Age also impacted how respondents deemed importance of "economic development partnerships" as an issue. Those typically in the working age groups (25-34, 35-44, 45-54, and 55-64) all indicated this was a "very important" issue over 70% of the time, while those aged 18 to 24 only deemed the issue "very important" 66% of the time and those 65 plus deemed it "very important" only 54% of the time.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

#### Recommendations #1-

Form a taskforce to examine how universities and colleges, the local governments, and community groups could better work together on the issues identified in the survey as "very important". Particular focus should be given to "economic development partnerships", "using university research to create jobs and new businesses", and "public safety" issues. The next most important issues to focus on would be "public transportation", "how local government can encourage starting new businesses" and "traffic issues". There may be some realized benefit to stakeholders being in the same room rather than operating in silos. The data provide strong evidence that the Town and Gown Tallahassee Process is needed and justified.

The taskforce should consider some of the events that are already successful within the community as models. One such event might be the Seven Days of Opening Nights festival, this annual event is now more than a decade old and while it is a Florida State University production, it is widely known and attended by the community at large.

This taskforce should also consider previous work by the Knight Foundation (Soul of the Community Project) that would indicate that a driver for economic success is impacted by the connectivity citizens feel to the community. Fostering a community environment that ties people to their community, whether they are working residents or students, has economic benefits for that community. There is evidence that the students attending universities and colleges in Tallahassee do not have a particularly strong tie to Tallahassee itself. Building those ties could have very positive benefits for the Tallahassee community as a whole.

#### **Recommendation #2-**

Universities and colleges and the local governments should make efforts to improve the quality of communications among the various stakeholders. Again, this should be a particular focus of the local governments based on the survey results.

One avenue to achieving this might be to identify various meetings where it would be appropriate to have a representative from one of the other parties in attendance. For example: Having representatives from the universities and colleges in attendance at regularly scheduled City of Tallahassee Commissioners meetings.

Another method might be to develop a shared website that provides a single portal by which information related to community relations is posted by all parties.

#### Recommendation #3-

Universities and colleges and the local governments need to have greater inclusion of citizens in their discussions concerning efforts to form better relationships. This recommendation should be particularly stressed for the efforts being made by local government based on the survey results and the general notion that forming community relations that benefit the community at

large is a basic function of local government.

In making an effort to be more inclusive both universities and colleges and the local governments should make an effort to have greater representation of varying age groups and citizens of varying education levels participating in discussions.

# METHODOLOGY TALLAHASSEE COMMUNITY SURVEY

The Town and Gown Community Survey is based on a telephone survey sample of the adult Tallahassee population (18 years or older). Sample telephone numbers included a random subsample of cell phones and a random landline sample for Leon County.

Fieldwork for the study was conducted under the professional supervision of Anneliese R. Oppenheim, Research Director, from the phone bank at Oppenheim Research.

Interviewers called approximately 6,000 of the numbers to complete the desired number of questionnaires (800). Approximately 18,000 telephone calls were attempted.

Callback arrangements were made for all households not able to respond at the initial contact. Refusals were called back a second time to increase the response rate. Generally, refusal conversion techniques yield a five percent increase in response rates and eliminate some response bias seen in surveys with low response rates due to high refusal rates. The sampling procedures used for this survey produce a representative sample of the Leon County households with landline phone numbers. To increase representation of non-landline households a sub-sample of cell phones was included.

Oppenheim Research relies exclusively on trained and paid interviewers for survey research projects. All interviewers received special training on project specifics.

Professionally trained and experienced supervisors oversaw all interviewing. Most of the interviewing was done Monday through Friday, between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. and between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturday. Some callback arrangements requested daytime call backs, and were attempted between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. during regular business hours.

Fieldwork dates for this survey were October 4 to 28, 2010. A total of 813 residents were interviewed. Interviews lasted an average of 10 to 15 minutes and the cooperation rate was 60 percent.

All surveys are subject to sampling error, which refers to the extent to which sample results differ from what would be obtained if the entire population had been interviewed. The survey has a margin of error of plus or minus 3.5 percentage points. If the sampling was repeated in the same time period, results could vary by plus or minus 3.5 percentage points 95 percent of the time. Thus, the study's confidence level is 95 percent.
